

## **Disable windows activation**

If you do a fresh install on a machine that came with Windows 7 or 8, just check that you don't have a key, and Windows will install and be activated automatically, provided [Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118 ] you install the same version, that came on the machine originally, ( Home, Pro, etc.). You can still install 10 on a pre 7 machine, and it will still work, just ignore the activate Windows notices. Bearing in mind that Windows could change their mind and pull the plug on your pre 7 install at any time. You are after all using it illegally.[Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118 ]

[Toll free +1 (844) 886-3118 ] The watermark can be removed by using Command Prompt (bcdedit -set TESTSIGNING OFF), Registry Editor (changing PaintDesktopVersion to 0 or 4), or moving slmgr files.
